This system offers users many more options such as the ability to query, browse, report and print maps from their own computers. You may view the tax maps in both a map view and an aerial view. Note From the Town Clerk's Office

Dog Licenses were due on April 30th. Failure to license a dog is a violation of state law and town ordinances. In addition to the annual license fee you will be charged a late fee of \$1.00 per month for each month late. You are subject to a civil forfeiture fee of \$25.00 due within 15 days after receiving notice of forfeiture. If this fee isn't paid, the case may be brought to the Candia District Court.

Transfer Station Information

Safety is always a concern at the Transfer Station. There is a stop sign located at the end of the entrance to the facility. Please help by stopping at this stop sign. There are times when the Transfer Station is very hectic. We see a large number of near collisions happening involving both pedestrians and vehicles. Please drive slowly and with great care at all times. Parents, it is wonderful to encourage your child's participation in recycling but please do not leave them unattended. There are times when we see them climb up and around the recycling containers which could seriously hurt them. Please keep children close by at all times. Recycling is one of the easiest ways to reduce your taxes! Please help us in our recycling efforts at the Transfer Station. We have moved the location where you dispose aluminum cans. Aluminum cans are now to be placed directly into a large dumpster. There is sometimes confusion as to which container is for the various cans. Whenever you are not sure where to place your items please ask an attendant - they are there to help vou. If items are placed into the wrong containers the entire container can be considered "contaminated" and the town will not receive the best rate (or no revenue at all) for contaminated recyclables.
