Summer Camp 2020

Members of the Summer Camp Sub-Committee reported that they had met with Deb and Nick recently to review the financial results from the 2019 Summer Camp and begin to plan for 2020. Four proposed changes were put forward including 1) A daily fee increase; 2) A drop-in fee increase; 3) Incorporating a \$25 trip fee; and 4) Collecting Camp payments in instalments before the Program begins. Projected revenues and costs were provided along with examples of the Premium Trips lineup and associated expenses.

Deb shared her sensitivity to raising prices on families for a second year in a row, while at the same time appreciating that the Department wants to avoid a repeat of the losses realized in 2019. Requiring families to commit to dates and pre-pay, or make a material deposit, will allow her to schedule Staffing appropriately.

Motion: J. Shute moves to recommend increasing the 2020 Summer Camp daily fee from \$25 to \$30, to increase the early drop-in fee from \$3/day per child to \$5/day per child, and to collect Camp payments in installments with 100% due on or before June 1st.

DPR Financial Update

E. Menard presented the Commission with a year to date summary of the 80 fund financials. (See Appendix 1).

It was noted that \$520 in revenue in the Adult Co-ed Softball line should have been attributed to Adult Yoga and will be updated. The \$300 donation made in January by Erica Menard is not yet reflected in the 80 fund as the check remains with DPR.

Baseball/Softball Registration Launch

K. Hill provided a summary of the Direct Annual Costs for Youth Baseball and Softball and the potential profit/loss per player based on Full Price and Early Bird Registrations.

The sign up for volunteers will be distributed shortly.

Old Business

T. Crotty asked re: the status of the \$300 donation, noting that at the January meeting a motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved, to establish a new line in the 80 fund to hold monies earmarked for program scholarships.

There was some confusion and disagreement around the purpose of the Joe Stone Scholarship. Additionally there was uncertainty regarding the mechanics of creating a new line within the 80 fund (revolving account) for the donation, versus placing the money under the separate account that currently holds the Joe Stone Scholarship (81 fund) versus creating an entirely new line in the Town Budget (i.e. 82 fund). E. Menard will work with Pete Lemay in the Finance Office to determine the pros/cons of each approach and return with a more clear recommended path forward.
