Review of Minutes

DPR Financial Update

E. Menard presented the Commission with a year to date summary of the 80 fund financials. (See Appendix 1). N. Lawrence noted that the \$5,000 in revenue in the Senior Programs line was an anonymous donation made to that programming. The Commission thanked the anonymous donor. K. Libby asked what purchase was made for \$500 in the Major Equipment line, N. Lawrence will check to find out.

E. Menard updated that she spoke with Pete in the Town Finance Office and that adding an additional sub-line to the 81 fund, the line that carries the Joe Stone Scholarship monies, would be a good place to hold funds donated for programming scholarships.

Baseball/Softball Registration Launch

K. Hill reviewed the registration numbers to date and the communication pushes that have been going out via Constant Contact and social media. In place of an Opening Day event this year DPR is planning to hold a mid-season photo day and ceremonies on 5/30. Evaluations will be held Saturday 3/14 and volunteers are needed around Noon to help Tim Griffin in setting up the sound and light equipment.

Deerfield Hoops Classic

N. Lawrence updated that 30 teams have registered, a number that is down slightly from last year. The volunteer slots filled so far look good. They are keeping an eye on the COVID-19 situation and will address it as needed.

J. D'Agostino voiced community feedback that there was frustration that the Hoops Classic is run as a competitive tournament and that Deerfield Recreation Teams participating don't seem to be well matched. The question was raised whether equal playing time expectations from the Recreation season carry into the tournament. It was agreed that a post-tournament discussion on the topic would be helpful.

N. Brown shared that the Deerfield 3/4 Boys and 5/6 Boys teams played in an Alton Tournament recently. The 5/6 Boys teams competed against each other in the Championship game and brought home 1st and 2nd place. Additionally the 3/4 Girls team recently attended the UNH Women's Basketball game, a very fun and positive experience for everyone.

Joe Stone Scholarship

K. Libby reminded everyone of the SignUp Genius for baked goods and snacks on 4/18. A volunteer is needed to take lead on updating the application documents and circulating to CHS, Coe Brown and the FORUM. Brian Fisher agreed to help out.

Summer Entertainment Series

DPR is looking for feedback on the Summer Entertainment Series. This is programming that brings no revenue into the revolving fund. The 2020 DPR Budget put forward included \$2,000 in funds for the Series, but if the Budget fails associated

costs will have to be carried by the revolving fund. N. Lawrence asked for feedback around whether the Series should be continued, which nights of the week work, and the types of entertainment residents would like to see. J. D'Agostino suggested putting together a community survey. N. Lawrence will create and circulate.

Other Business

N. Lawrence updated the Commission on the Grant Extension application process for the Hartford Brook project. The deadline to apply for the extension is May 2020 and, if approved, this would give an additional two years to complete the necessary ADA work. Currently, without meeting full ADA requirements, 75% of the Grant can be received (\$18,750). K. Libby suggested that DPR should put in for reimbursement of the 75% and apply for the extension to allow for the remaining 25% to be received once the work is complete. Members and DPR Staff were in agreement.

Regarding Commission membership, K. Libby noted that, in addition to the two vacated by Members Bryan Giard and Tom Buffington, terms are expiring March 30, 2020 for Katherine Libby and Nate Brown.
