general provisions. One new section on prohibited uses was added to specify potential threats to wetlands and YES surface waters, such as salt sheds and hazardous waste facilities. Finally, the district boundaries have been revised to include wetlands as well as areas within 100 feet of the wetland area. The boundaries also specify what is not included in the wetland district - manmade ditches and ponds and other similar manmade water bodies. The Deerfield Planning Board voted to support this amendment by a vote of 4-0-1.

NFORMATION: Hartford Brook houses the newest playground in Deerfield and fencing is needed to ensure that children are kept safe at play. The playground was built via major donations from Deerfield Cooperative Preschool, Deerfield Parks and Recreation and volunteer labor. Similarly, tree trimming is needed to ensure children stay safe by minimizing the risk of falling limbs along the property line at the GBW Building. Costs of field maintenance in 2020 consist of infield mix material for two of our four ballfields with a full infield restoration performed by a professional on one of the fields. Playground mulching covers the cost of new bark mulch on at all three of Deerfield's playgrounds locations.
